Martin, Bill Pickett Cowboy and Vice Mayor of the City of District Heights hosted Lita Gray, Eric Bowers, Abraham (Abe) and Laverne A. Parks at the western cabaret sponsored by the Bill Pickett Rodeo. It was a wonderful affair held at the District Heights Community Center. TI members hand danced and danced a number of different western line dances.

Mr. Martin armed with a six-shooter and sporting one of his many rodeo prize belt buckles was a gracious host who regaled TI members with stories about the African-American cowboys and cowgirls of the famous Bill Pickett Invitational Rodeo. The Bill Pickett Invitational Rodeo is an innovative, educational and exciting perspective on the history, challenges, and excitement of Black Americans in the western United States. It celebrates the life of the legendary Black cowboy Bill Pickett and other blacks who greatly contributed to the development of the west. In November 2008, the 25th Anniversary of the Bill Pickett Rodeo was held at the South Point Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada.

Passing of Herb Grimes, Co-Producer of the documentary, "Dance Party: The Teenarama Story".

Producer and director Herb Grimes a dancer on the original Teenarama Dance Party show that aired on WOOK-TV Ch. 14 in Washington, DC from 1963 to 1970 departed this life on Friday, November 7, 2008. Herb's homegoing service was on Friday, November 14, 2008, at the St. Theresa Avila Church, 1244 V Street, SE

(13th & V), Washington, DC 20020.

Herb was President of his production company, Nyle Productions, and was a 10-year veteran producer and director at WHMM-TV (now WHUT-TV Howard University Television) in Washington, DC. Herb was an award winner in his field. He received such distinguished awards as the regional Emmy and Ciba Award as Co-Producer of the program "All Things Considered.....Black" and a regional Emmy Award for the documentary "Dance Party: The Teenarama Story" (2006 PBS), which also received the Telly and Aurora Awards for broadcast excellence.

Herb was a friend and an asset to the Teenarama Incorporated organization. The members of Teenarama Incorporated extend our condolences to the Grimes family. Rest well friend.

Passing of Reverend Earl Luckett

Reverend Earl Luckett, beloved father of Reginald and Frances Luckett of our Teenarama family passed in December 2008.
